THEME

God has made a covenant with Israel in which He will be their God and they will be His obedient people. Israel has betrayed this covenant which we see exampled in the broken marriage of Hosea and Gomer. God ultimately restores the unfaithful nation and renews his covenant with them.

1:2 (Gomer and Israel are unfaithful)
4:6 (The people reject God)
6:6 (what God wants from the people)
11:8-9 (God's faithful love for his
people)



valley associated with idolatry and murder (1 Kings 21:1-16)

- Lo-ruhamah "No Mercy" (daughter)Lo-ammi "Not My People" (son)
 - 1:10-11 Restoration promised
- 2:1-23 Poem focusing on the unfaithfulness of the nation and God's coming judgement and restoration.
 - 3:1-5 Hosea restores Gomer

Hosea 14 Final Restoration

- 14:1-3 A loving call to return to God
- 14:4-7 Healing and blooming of a restored people
- 14:8-9 A reminder of the wisdom found in following God, not idols

Hosea is from Israel (7:5)

Historical Notes

Written at similar time as Amos

Jeroboam II King of Israel (Bad King)

Hosea's prophesies are more intense than Amos's

Other Themes

Knowing God - Hebrew "yada" to know relationally (2:20, 5:9, 6:3, 7:9, 8:2, etc)

God's loyal love "Hesed" for his people is rejected (2:19, 4:1, 6:4, 6:6, 10:12)

Baal - Canaanite false god that was a main source of apostasy and idolatry in Israel.
